- Performs preliminary review of plans for compliance with the above regulations
- Visits properties on a pre-established routine basis as well as special incidental basis to observe structures, and their use relative to the above-mentioned codes
- Manages assigned areas and projects for compliance as determined by the Building Administrator
- Issues warnings, correction notices, stop work orders and civil infractions
- Keeps accurate records; and, in conjunction with the State's Attorney prepares cases for legal action against persons violating any of the above codes
- Testifies in court proceedings as needed
- Approves Certificates of Occupancy and Zoning Certificates when all work has been completed and approved
- Completes assigned tasks accurately and by established deadlines.
- Cross train and back up other staff as needed.
