<u>UTILITY MECHANIC I – JOB SUMMARY:</u> Under general supervision, operates heavy equipment used in the daily operation of the landfill. Performs various maintenance and construction duties.

<u>UTILITY MECHANIC II – JOB SUMMARY:</u> Under general supervision, drives commercial weight vehicles (over 26,000 lbs.) and operates heavy equipment used in the daily operation of the landfill. Performs various maintenance and construction duties.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

FOR ALL UTILITY MECHANICS:

- Essential personnel subject to emergency call-back with little or no notice
- Successfully pass pre-employment background check
- Possession of a valid driver's license and driving record with less than 4 points (MD)
- Safety sensitive position requiring Drug & Alcohol Testing

ADDITIONAL GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR UTILITY MECHANIC II:

- Possession of a valid Class" A" license with Tanker endorsement upon employment and driving record with less than 4 points (MD)
- Safety sensitive position subject to DOT drug & alcohol testing; cannabis is prohibited.

ESSENTIAL JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

FOR ALL UTILITY MECHANICS:

- Conducts daily operational inspections and repairs of pump stations and landfill cells
- Examine Leachate pumps and storage tank and record levels
- Performs general maintenance on Leachate tanks and trucks
- Operates heavy landfill equipment such as bulldozers, track and rubber tire loaders, landfill compactors, off-road dump trucks, excavators and operation of landfill grinders as required to perform assigned tasks
- Participates in the daily upkeep including planting grass, placing mating and straw, cutting grass in various county locations and other related duties as assigned by the Landfill Supervisors
- Performs preventative and routine maintenance on the above vehicles, tools, and other equipment.
- Makes minor repairs to vehicles and assists the vehicle mechanic with major repairs
- Performs and leads others in the performance of semi-skilled and skilled labor tasks
- Knowledge of proper safety procedures and PPE utilization at all times to perform job related duties.
- Ensures confidentiality of information and records and complies with the record retention schedule.
- Complies with the safety programs, procedures, training, fire drills, COOP plans, etc. and works safely
- Adheres to the Worcester County Government Personnel Rules & Regulations and works in a pleasant and harmonious manner with co-workers and the general public
- Performs other duties as assigned. This position will be cross trained in other positions as needed.

ADDITIONAL ESSENTIAL JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR UTILITY MECHANIC II:

• Transports Leachate to treatment plant

• Drives and operates commercial weight, single and tandem-axle vehicles and tractors with semitrailer or tanker

QUALIFICATIONS AND SKILLS

- High school diploma or GED equivalent
- Possession of a driving record with less than 4 points (MD)
- Knowledge of the operation/functions of the tools/equipment used in the maintenance/repair of machinery
- Ability to follow verbal and written instructions; keep records and logs; complete written forms; and to communicate effectively with the public and coworkers
- Ability to apply acquired knowledge to increasingly varied and complex tasks
- Ability to perform manual physical labor including frequent walking, bending, stooping, lifting, and carrying heavy objects up to 50 lbs., and the operation of vehicles, tools, and equipment
- Knowledge of safety procedures

SAFETY ANALYSIS
